But at Eagle Lighting, we want to go further...




# Sustainability at Eagle Lighting

- Investing in a 100KW solar system for the manufacturing facility to reduce factory CO2 emission levels.
- Deepening our commitment to local and responsible sourcing as part of our Sustainable Business Strategy.
- Our Responsible Procurement Framework is integrated into our quality management system, setting a high standard for us and our suppliers. We remain accountable through ISO 9001 Quality Management Systems.

Products that are developed to lower impact to both the environment and people and to support the circular economy.


#### SDG 13: Climate action
